<b>AAP (Advanced Academics Program)</b>	<a href="https://www.fcps.edu/academics/middle-school-academics-7-8/advanced-academics">https://www.fcps.edu/academics/middle-school-academics-7-8/advanced-academics</a>	Glasgow MS offers a school-based, <a href="#">Level IV Center</a> program for students from area middle schools identified as eligible for Level IV services by FCPS and the Office of Advanced Academics.

Glasgow's teachers and staff are available via phone and email, and for individual meetings. Your child's counselor can help if you wish to meet with several of your student's teachers at the same time. Staff does its best to return emails in a timely fashion (24hrs).

Get to know who is responsible for which programs and areas in order to know who to contact should you have any questions.
<b>AFFINITY PROGRAMS - Grocery Store loyalty programs, Amazon Smile, Box Tops</b>	<a href="http://www.glasgowpta.org/support">http://www.glasgowpta.org/support</a>	Many grocery stores allow shoppers to "link" store loyalty cards to non-profit organizations. Merchants then donate a portion of what you've spent to those groups. Some stores require that you <u>relink your grocery store cards each year</u> . AmazonSmile also has a program that lets Glasgow benefit each time you shop.
<b>AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/activities">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/activities</a>	Glasgow offers an after-school program in a safe, supervised environment, starting about a month after the start of school. The program supports school work, and enriches interests and talents. Each day, students' first session is for academic support; their second session is for activities. Activities end by 4:45pm. Friday consists of recreational activities without academics, unless arranged on a student-teacher basis. Students sign up online the day before, or during lunch on the day they wish to stay after school. If an activity

		fills up, staff is available at lunch to help select an alternative. (See LATE BUS.)
<b>AGENDA BOOKS</b>		At the start of the year, Glasgow gives each student an agenda to be used for organizing assignments and tracking due dates. Agendas also serve as a hall pass when out of class, and for confirming after-school attendance. The PTA® contributes to the cost of agendas. Replacements are in the main office for \$5.

It is available in multiple languages.
<b>ARRIVAL - when students can enter the building</b>		7:05am is the earliest students may enter the building, at Door #1. Do not drop off students earlier, or arrive earlier and wait in the car with your child. Beginning at 7:10am, students may access the breakfast program or wait in the gym. At 7:20am they will be released to get to class.
<b>ASSESSMENTS</b>		As an IB World School, we use two forms of assessments: <b>Formatives:</b> All homework and many classroom tasks are formative assessments. Students receive credit for attempting and completing these assignments. Feedback is designed to improve student understanding and performance. Formatives count for 10% of a student's grade. <b>Summatives:</b> Summative assessments are administered at the end of a unit. They help students judge their academic progress toward State standards and MYP aims and objectives. Teachers tell students whether they can retake their summative to demonstrate content mastery and improve grades.

AVID's mission is to close the

		achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society.

Band meets during the regular school day. Students learn to play an instrument, and perform in school and at local and regional concerts.
<b>BELL SCHEDULE</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedules">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedules</a>	The bell schedule structures the day and tells when to switch classes, rooms and activities. The official school day is 7:30am to 2:15pm. Normal, delayed, and early-release bell schedules are posted on Glasgow's website.

(See ONLINE ACCESS)
<b>BLOCK SCHEDULE</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedules">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedules</a>	Classes are organized into "blocks" of time, and Odd and Even days. Schedules indicate which "block" students are in throughout the course of each day.
<b>BOOK FAIR</b>		Glasgow sponsors two book fairs each year, selling a variety of books and other items that appeal to middle-school readers and raising money that helps the Librarians purchase more materials, mostly for students to borrow and enjoy.
<b>BTS = Back To School Night</b>		Parents and guardians are invited to attend BTS to meet their student's teachers, see their classrooms, learn more about what to expect – and what is expected from their student. BTS does not include time for individual conferences. This year, Back to School Night is <a href="#">October 3rd</a> .
<b>BUILDING SECURITY</b>		Glasgow uses an electronic visitor control system. Visitors must present a government-issued, picture identification card in order to enter, through Door #1. Visitors check in at the main office before going elsewhere in the building. First-time visitors register in the electronic visitor control system and take a photo. The information is stored in the system for future visits. Once registered in the system, check in each time to receive a visitor's badge. Before leaving Glasgow, scan the visitor's badge to check out.
<b>CALENDAR, School</b>	<a href="https://www.fcps.edu/index.php/events">https://www.fcps.edu/index.php/events</a>	All FCPS schools follow calendars designated by FCPS. Glasgow follows the Standard School Year Calendar.
<b>CAREER DAY</b>		Career Day is held at the end of the school year. Volunteers from a variety of career fields visit school so that eighth graders can learn about each career, what schooling the volunteers completed, and what led them to choose their career.

Chorus meets during the regular school day. Students sing in different languages, styles and musical genres, and perform in school, county, and area concerts. Our choruses are recognized in FCPS, the region, and the state.

Subscribe/unsubscribe at any time. For emergencies, there is also an option to receive information by phone and text.
<b>COMMUNITY SERVICE (Service Learning)</b>		Glasgow students complete community service hours in any of three categories: Creativity, Action, and Service. Service learning emphasizes personal reflection and learning from the experience. Additional information will be provided throughout the year.

Counselors work with students diligently to ensure that students are successful in the classroom. Students usually have the same counselor for his/her entire time at Glasgow so that both student and counselor can learn more about each other and become comfortable working together. Counselor can help with many concerns, questions, or challenges faced in middle school. Your child's assigned counselor is listed at the top of their schedule.
<b>DEVICES - personal</b>		Personally Owned Devices (PODs) are electronic devices (ex: cell phones, tablets etc.) owned by students/families and NOT provided by FCPS or Glasgow. They are for <b>instructional use in the classroom</b> , <u>only</u> with teacher permission and according to Glasgow POD rules. All PODs must be registered with Glasgow. Some examples of uses that are <u>not allowed</u> : Texting, Facebooking, Tweeting, and Phone Calls.

<p><b>DRILLS</b></p>		<p>Schools are required to hold regular safety drills such as:</p> <p><u>Lock-Down Drills</u>: Teachers lock their doors, close their blinds, cover their windows with black paper, move students to the ground away from doors and windows and keep students quiet and calm. They also might pull into their classrooms any students who were in the hallway at the time the drill was announced. Administrators and security walk through the entire building to ensure that all classrooms respond exactly as required.</p> <p><u>Fire Drills</u>: Students and teachers file out of the building to preset locations on school grounds, where attendance is verified before an all-clear is given to return to the building.</p>
<p><b>EARLY DISMISSAL for an individual student</b></p>	<p><a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/attendance-information">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/attendance-information</a> Main office: 703-813-8700</p>	<p>When a student needs to leave school during the school day, such as for a doctor or orthodontist appointment, notify the school in advance: students submit a note to the front office upon arrival, written by a parent or guardian. <u>You can use the Early Dismissal forms that you received in his/her back-to-school packet.</u> When you arrive to pick up your child, you will be asked to sign him/her out. The staff will call your child to the office so that you can leave for the appointment on time.</p>
<p><b>ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)</b></p>		<p>Glasgow's ESOL teachers, in collaboration with subject and grade level teams, support the English language development of ESOL students. ESOL students are assessed yearly, using WIDA (World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment) tool, to gauge their English proficiency. Performance on this important assessment determines the class level each ESOL student enters in the subsequent school year.</p>

<b>FREE &amp; REDUCED PRICE MEALS (F&amp;RM)</b>	<a href="https://www.fcps.edu/node/31381">https://www.fcps.edu/node/31381</a> Food and Nutrition Services: 703-813-4800 or 703-813-4844. Main Office: 703-813-8700	An income-based program that provides breakfasts and/or lunches to qualifying students. Free and reduced price meal applications are mailed to all households in August. If you do not receive an application or if you experience a change in income or household size, contact one of the offices at left for an application.
<b>FUNDRAISING - PTA®</b>	<a href="http://www.glasgowpta.org/support">http://www.glasgowpta.org/support</a>	The PTA® must raise funds to serve its purpose at Glasgow. This includes: Direct Donations, Affinity Programs, Restaurant nights, Membership Fees, and Spirit Wear sales.
<b>GLASGOW GAZETTE</b>		Principal DeRose sends a weekly message to all e-mails connected to Glasgow through the SIS system. The message includes announcements, reminders, and other helpful information for the Glasgow community.
<b>GOOGLE CLASSROOM</b>		Many teachers utilize this communication tool to engage their students, and some require that their students use it to complete their academic assignments. (See ONLINE ACCESS)
<b>GRADING</b>		Assessments are graded on a number scale of 1-8 in one of the four criterion for each subject. Each number corresponds with an achievement level of a student's mastery of content. Grades appear in the A-F format on Report Cards.
<b>HOMEWORK</b>		Homework assignments reinforce material presented in class and contribute to a student's overall grade. Assignments can be completed independently and are limited in length and the time needed to complete.
<b>HONOR ROLLS and ACADEMIC AWARDS</b>		At the end of each quarter, students who have earned all As or As and Bs are recognized. At the end of the year, teachers recognize significant achievement by selected students in each subject area, by grade. Parents of students receiving awards at the end-of year ceremony receive an invitation to attend.
<b>HOOP IT UP!</b>		Each spring, the PTA® sponsors a students vs. staff basketball challenge. It's an evening of laughter, crazy tricks, and amazing displays of fitness and skill in the gym. This is a well-loved highlight of annual PTA® and school activities.

Only select middle schools in Fairfax County have earned this designation and offer this prestigious program. IB schools share a commitment to a high quality, challenging, international education.

<b>INCLEMENT WEATHER</b>	<a href="https://www.fcps.edu/resources/safety-and-transportation/weather-cancellation-procedures">https://www.fcps.edu/resources/safety-and-transportation/weather-cancellation-procedures</a>	In case of inclement weather or other emergency situations, FCPS officials decide when to close schools for the entire day, open two hours late, or close two hours early. Parents should make arrangements now for the care of their children when schedules change, and in the rare situation when it is necessary to close an individual school because of a power failure or other circumstances. Children should know where to go or what to do if a parent is not home.
<b>KISS &amp; RIDE</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/node/1942">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/node/1942</a>	Kiss & Ride is the driving lane in front of the main school entrance, Door #1 (between the parking lot and the school building). It is the location for dropping off and picking up your child each day. Safety is the highest priority at Glasgow: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Pull all the way forward in line.</li> <li>* Do not park or get out of your vehicle in the Kiss &amp; Ride lane.</li> <li>* Be alert for people in the crosswalk.</li> <li>* Do not pull into parking spaces or rows and ask your child to come to you.</li> <li>* Do not use personal devices such as phones while in the Kiss &amp; Ride area.</li> </ul>
<b>LATE BUS</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/node/1942">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/node/1942</a>	During most of the school year, FCPS provides a second afternoon bus service – on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays – to transport students home from school. This “Late Bus” service lets many kids participate in after-school academic and extracurricular opportunities (See AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS) and still have a safe ride home. Typically, Late Bus operates between October and early June. Glasgow’s Late Bus routes and stops differ from the regular school-day runs. There are fewer buses and stops.

Together, we model the IB traits of honesty and respect in our communications, and use this tool to connect with and learn from each other. <b>LOCKERS</b>		All students receive a small gym locker. Music students might have an instrument locker. Most students carry their backpacks all day and do not use an academic locker.

<b>LUNCH</b>	<a href="https://www.myschoolbucks.com/ver2/login/getmain?requestAction=home">https://www.myschoolbucks.com/ver2/login/getmain?requestAction=home</a>	Students may bring lunch from home or purchase it at school. Four daily lunch periods (A, B, C, D) are organized according to which specific classes meet during the (extra-long) lunch & class block time. On Odd Days, Lunch and Period 5 work together. On Even Days, Lunch and Period 6 work together. (See ODD/EVEN DAYS.) 5 <sup>th</sup> and 6 <sup>th</sup> period class teachers tell students what time they have lunch.
<b>MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAM (MYP)</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/academics/international-baccalaureate-middle-years-programme">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/academics/international-baccalaureate-middle-years-programme</a>	The IB Middle Years Program is for students ages 11-16 (or in grades 6-10). It is a schoolwide approach to teaching and learning that benefits ALL students. The program helps students develop the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and skills necessary to participate actively and responsibly in a changing world. The curriculum is supported by the fundamental concepts of intercultural awareness, holistic learning and communication.
<b>MULTIPLE CLASSES - How does it work?</b>		In middle school, students change classrooms for each subject and have many teachers with different teaching styles. Core subjects (English, Math, History, Science) are grouped in grade-specific locations. Health/PE is in the gym and health rooms. Electives are in various locations. There are common academic policies that all teachers adhere to, and individual departments have specific guidelines for their teachers to follow as well. Teachers review the expectations for their classes at the start of the year, and many post them online as well (see ONLINE ACCESS). The school uses a single binder organizational system, to help students keep track of and be responsible for their academic work. Return Time and Panther Time support students as they learn about the expectations of middle school, particularly at the start of the year.

<b>ODD/EVEN DAYS</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedules">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/bell-schedules</a>	Students learn how to navigate odd/even days very quickly. Each student has eight periods in his/her schedule. In order to minimize transitions and give students a meaningful time period for instruction, the eight periods are split over two days. Odd Days are periods 1, 3, 5, and 7 (plus Panther/Return Time). Even Days are periods 2, 4, 6, and 7 (plus Panther/Return Time).

Some teachers use both Google Classroom and Blackboard. The



		Student Information System (See SIS) shows grades, a master calendar and more. Blackboard and SIS are accessed using the same username and password; with different views for parents and students. Google Classroom is accessed through student FCPS email accounts.

Orchestra meets during the regular school day. Glasgow's award-winning Orchestra consists of strings, woodwind, and brass instruments. Orchestra students perform in school, and at local and regional concerts.
<b>OUR PLACE in FCPS</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/region-2-schools">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/about/region-2-schools</a>	Several elementary schools feed into Glasgow, and Glasgow feeds into Stuart High School. We are in the Stuart pyramid within Region 2, one of the five administrative Regions within FCPS.
<b>P.E./GYM UNIFORMS</b>	Contact Mr. Cauthorn, Accauthorn@fcps.edu	Glasgow students are required to 'dress out' – change from their regular daily attire into the Glasgow gym uniform – for all physical education (PE) classes. Our gym uniform consists of blue athletic shorts and a grey Panther shirt. A uniform order form is in the back-to-school packet.
<b>PANTHER PRINCIPLES</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/academics/positive-behavior-interventions-supports-pbis-program">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/academics/positive-behavior-interventions-supports-pbis-program</a>	We embrace these three principles: <b>Kindness, Commitment, Safety</b> . Through Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (See PBIS), students learn what these mean in practice. We invite all community members to model these principles.
<b>PANTHER TIME</b>		Panther Time is a time for personal reflection, exploring Panther Principles, and building community. It takes place during the school day, meeting for 30 minutes. In any typical two-week period, Panther Time meets for 3 days and Return Time meets for 7 days. (See RETURN TIME.)
<b>PANTHERS</b>		We are the Glasgow Panthers. Our school colors are gray & blue. (See SPIRIT WEAR.)
<b>PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES</b>	<a href="https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/student-services">https://glasgowms.fcps.edu/student-services</a> Student Services: 703-813-8740	Formal parent/teacher conferences are not part of the regular school schedule. You can expect to hear from each of your student's teachers by email to monitor your child's progress, inform you of upcoming assignments or tests, or tell you about missing assignments or make-up/retake guidelines. If a meeting is needed, email the individual teacher to set a time. If you wish to meet with multiple teachers, contact your child's counselor to help facilitate scheduling or conferences.

It's a team-based approach, led by a staff member specifically dedicated to strengthening this program and promoting a positive environment at Glasgow.
